Monthly Gardening Calendar – April Jobs



1. Planting:

- April is a great time for planting a variety of vegetables, flowers, shrubs and trees. Make sure to check your local climate and plant accordingly.

2. Weeding:

- As the weather warms up, weeds start to grow more vigorously. Spend time pulling weeds to prevent them from competing with your desired plants for nutrients and space.

3. Mulching:

- Apply a layer of mulch to your garden beds to help retain moisture, suppress weeds and regulate soil temperature.

4. Pruning:

- Prune shrubs and trees as needed to remove dead or diseased branches and to shape them for the growing season.

5. Fertilising:

- If you haven't done so already, apply fertilizer to your garden beds to provide nutrients for your plants. Make sure to follow the instructions on the fertilizer package.

6. Watering:

- As the weather gets warmer, plants may require more frequent watering. Be sure to water deeply and consistently, especially for newly planted items.

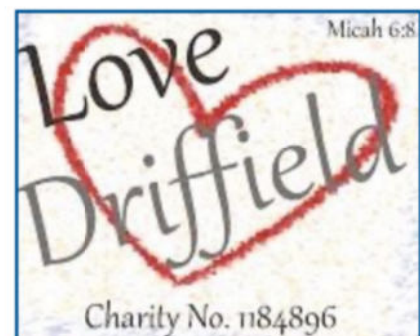

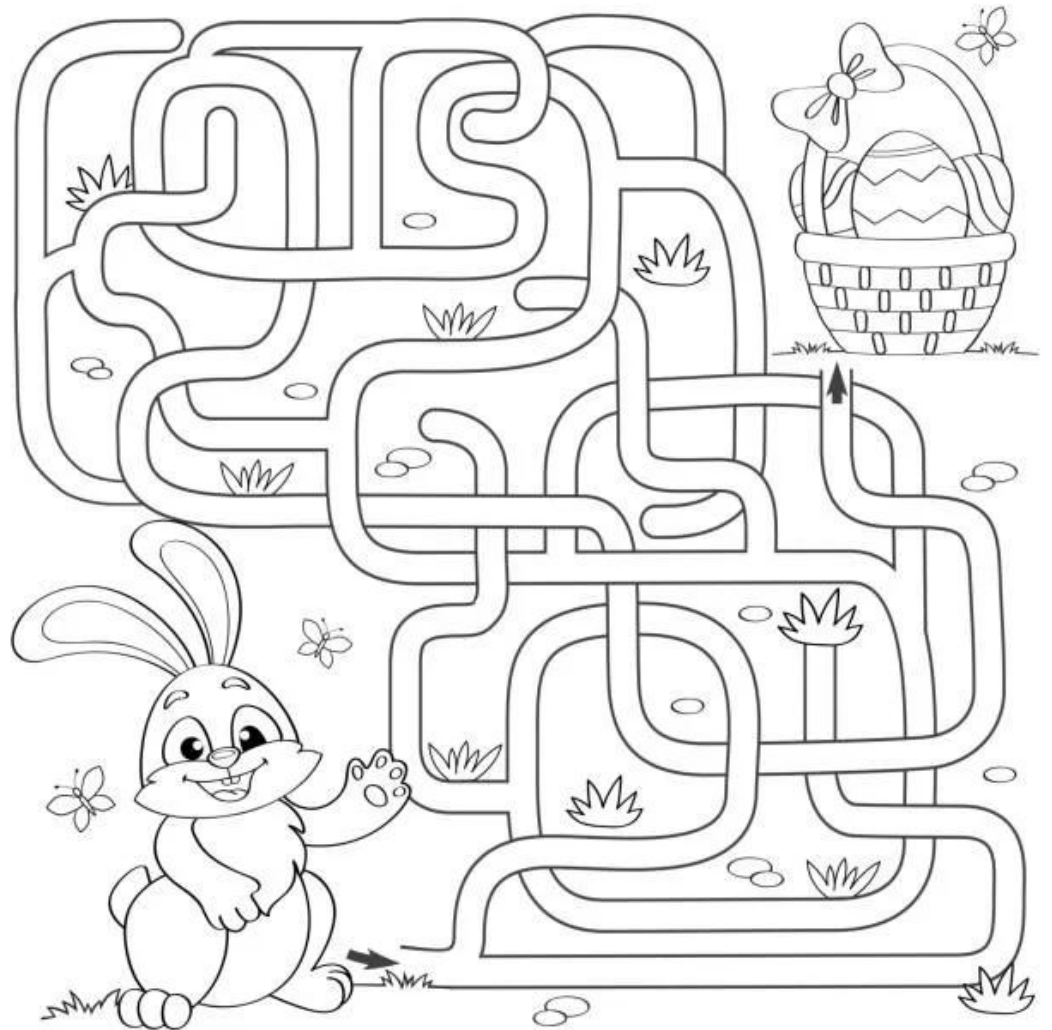

Rudston's Recipes

LEMON HERB GRILLED CHICKEN WITH SPRING SALAD

Ingredients

- 4 boneless, skinless chicken breasts
- 2 lemons, juiced and zested
- 3 tbsp olive oil
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tsp fresh thyme leaves
- 2 tsp fresh rosemary, chopped
- Salt and pepper to taste
- Mixed salad greens
- 1 cup cherry tomatoes, halved
- ½ cucumber, sliced
- ¼ red onion, thinly sliced
- Balsamic vinaigrette dressing

Method

- In a small bowl, whisk together the lemon juice, lemon zest, olive oil, minced garlic, thyme, rosemary, salt, and pepper to create the marinade.
- Place the chicken breasts in a shallow dish or resealable plastic bag. Pour the marinade over the chicken, ensuring it is evenly coated. Cover or seal and refrigerate for at least 30 minutes, or up to 4 hours.
- Preheat your grill to medium-high heat. Remove the chicken from the marinade and discard any excess marinade.
- Grill the chicken breasts for 6-8 minutes per side, or until they are cooked through and reach an internal temperature of 165°F/75°C. Remove from the grill and let rest for a few minutes before slicing.
- While the chicken is grilling, prepare the salad by tossing together the mixed greens, cherry tomatoes, cucumber, and red onion in a large bowl.
- Serve the grilled chicken slices over the spring salad, drizzling with balsamic vinaigrette dressing just before serving.

Rudston's Recipes (continued)

PORK TENDERLOIN WITH HONEY GARLIC SAUCE

Ingredients (Serves 5)

2 pork tenderloins (pork fillet) around 500g/1lb each,
(trimmed to remove skin, if desired)

1½ tbsp olive oil

3 garlic gloves

Pork Tenderloin Rub

½ tsp garlic powder

½ tsp paprika

½ tsp salt

½ tsp black pepper

Honey Garlic Sauce

3 tbsp cider vinegar

1½ tbsp light soy sauce

½ cup honey or maple syrup -

personally I use less (around 4oz honey)

Method

- Pre-heat the oven to 180°C/350°F/Gas Mark 4
- Mix all the Sauce ingredients together.
- Mix all the Rub ingredients together and then sprinkle evenly over the pork.
- Heat the oil in a large ovenproof frying pan/skillet over a high heat and then add the pork to sear. When the pork is almost done, push to the side and add the garlic. Cook until pork is golden all over.
- Pour the sauce in. Turn the pork once and then transfer straight away into the oven. If you don't have an ovenproof pan, transfer everything onto a tray to bake.
- Roast for 15-18 minutes (for no pink) or 13 minutes (for slightly pink) or until the internal temperature is 68°C/155°F. It may be necessary to cook a little longer if the tenderloin is bigger, however don't overcook it or the pork will be tough.
- Remove pork onto a plate, cover loosely with foil and rest for 5 minutes.
- Place pan with sauce on stove over a medium/high heat (or pour sauce from tray back into the pan to heat), simmer rapidly for 3 minutes until sauce reduces down to a thin syrup.
- Remove from the stove, put pork in and turn to coat with sauce.
- Cut pork into thick slices and serve with the sauce.
