The Christmas meeting of the history group was an informal occasion. An interesting variety of artefacts was brought along – coins of all eras found by a metal detectorist; a rock from just outside the village showing a geological fault; pencils used on school slates, found in someone's garden, and many others. Everyone enjoyed looking at the different objects and chatting about them, and refreshments were served complete with mince pies. A vote of thanks was given to John who organises these fascinating meetings, to Ann, Val and Margaret for the refreshments and to anyone who helps. This was met with a very hearty round of applause.

At the January meeting Dr Peter Halkon MA FSA, Senior Lecturer in Archaeology at the University of Hull spoke to a large audience on "Later Prehistoric Landscapes of the Yorkshire Wolds – Recent Research"

This talk concentrated on the areas of the Wolds escarpment where there are shallow silty soils over chalk, and covered the period from the Bronze Age to the end of the Roman period. New research concentrated on three hilltop sites – Kipling House Farm, Nunburnholme Wold and Arras.

At Kipling House Farm a geophysical survey confirmed what had been thought, that there had been a Bronze Age ring fort, like that at Thwing. The entrances pointed east. Drones gave an aerial view, showing the condition of the plant growth and this reflected the soil depth and type.

Excavation of the site revealed pottery of the late Bronze Age and early Iron Age. Also animal bone, mostly of cattle and pigs. Evidence was found of a massive round house, 22 metres across, it appears that a later round house was built on top of the remains of this. This shows that hill forts were used later than had been previously thought. It is possible that the original round house burnt down.

At Nunburnholme Wold square barrows were discovered. Geophysical surveying and field walking showed a large open area, surrounded by enclosures. It is possible that this was an area for cattle handling. The presence of Anglo Saxon burials shows that old sites were re used.

At the Arras cemetery near Market Weighton many barrows were opened at the time of the original investigation in 1817. Four of the barrows contained remains of a chariot or a cart. In modern times further research was undertaken by Dr Ian Stead and then by Dr Halkon .

At Pocklington in 2017 and 2019 two chariot burials were discovered, and for the first time the burials had the horses with the chariots.

There are 28 chariot burials in the Yorkshire area, only 2 others have been found in the UK one in Pembroke and one near Edinburgh. There is also a clutch of chariot burials to the north of Paris, which makes us think of links to the Parisii tribe her.

Dr Halkon's talk held the audience spellbound.

The February meeting is on Thursday February 27th at 7pm in the Village Hall. Mr Fred Walkington MBE will talk on "The History of Spurn Head" Admission including refreshments is just £2 and everyone is welcome.

Why don't both sides come together to discuss your problems and solve them without fighting, instead try to solve them with love and friendship. Try and combine your ideas to make new ones that you will both like.




