

No Christian is solitary; through our baptism we become members of one body through Christ. On All Saints day (1<sup>st</sup> November) we remember this mutual belonging; giving thanks for the men and women, past and present, ordinary and special, who God is at work in and inspire us.

The day after All Saints day is All Soul's Day. This traditionally invites us to remember those we personally love but no longer see. This year it falls on a Wednesday and in church, at our morning service, there will be the opportunity for anyone to light a candle as a personal act of remembering someone close to you. Remembrance Sunday goes on to explore the theme of memory, both corporate and individual, as we confront issues of war and peace, loss and self-gift, memory and forgetting.

As in past years we will have an act of remembrance at the war memorial at 11am.

Finally; November also sees the end of the annual cycle of the church year and the new one begins on Advent Sunday (get your calendars ready something is coming!).

We also hope to clean the twigs and branches that are laid on the ground. We have spoken to Mr. Watson and Mr Smallwood to ask what they would like too.

On August 2nd, we did our bike ride. It wasn't as tiring as we thought, but the last 5 miles were still quite hard work. We have raised over £350. We hope the wildlife will like what we are doing and the village too. We are now buying our bird boxes etc. And hope to put some up soon.


Thanks to them and past members who have all contributed to (usually) orderly meetings. It makes life a little easier for the Clerk when the only problems are "without" rather than within.


