The meeting was attended by over 80 residents and 2 ward councillors, to gauge the support of the local community in making a bid for the Bosville Arms. The support was unanimous in favour of a bid to purchase and run this pub, maintaining it as a village asset. A questionnaire, showed that a large number of residents would offer assistance to restore the site to its previous condition.

The Bosville Arms, in its present bedraggled and shabby state is indeed a blemish on our beautiful village; an utter disgrace. It was with sadness that I was looking on the Rudston website at a copy of the November 2014 newsletter, showing a photo of the pub on the front cover.

The church turret clock was made in 1856 and has since served the village well and it should continue to do so for many years to come. However it did need winding and a huge thanks to those who every week have climbed the tower stairs and wound the clock (quite a hard job; a bit like cranking an old car!). No more need to risk life, limb and your back: the automatic winder is fitted and working. The clock mechanism remains exactly the same but three motorized automatic winding pulleys do the work. A big thanks to Simon and Angela Dawson who have met the cost. They have done this in memory of Simon's father Alan, who some of you will have known. He served the church faithfully for many years. If any turret clock enthusiasts are out there (I know there are some around!) get in touch and I'll give you all the history and details. Every blessing








